Dear Minister Zwozdesky:

The mandate letter you received last year outlined the priorities you were expected to focus on as Minister of Aboriginal Relations and member of our Cabinet team. Through your leadership, and the hard work of all our ministries, considerable progress has been made on our ambitious agenda. This letter updates and refocuses the initiatives identified last spring. It reflects progress made to date and details the adjustments to keep the strong forward momentum necessary to ensure Alberta remains the best place to live, work, visit and invest in.

We are moving forward in a time of uncertainty. Our past actions have positioned Alberta well. However, to protect Albertans and keep building our province for the long term we must adapt to changing realities and manage within our fiscal capacity.

Our business plan will continue to set out the actions we will take to deliver on our five priorities over the next year. We will also continue to publicly report on these priorities as a part of our regular business planning cycle, allowing Albertans to measure our progress as a government.

In order to fulfill the commitments we made last spring and to continue to focus on the outcomes of most importance to Albertans, our priorities remain:

1. **Resourceful. Responsible** - Ensure Alberta's energy resources are developed in an environmentally sustainable way.
2. **A Healthy Approach** - Increase access to quality health care and improve the efficiency and effectiveness of health care service delivery.
3. **Strong Communities** - Promote strong and vibrant communities and reduce crime so Albertans feel safe.
4. **Creating Opportunity** - Enhance value-added activity, increase innovation, and build a skilled workforce to improve the long-run sustainability of Alberta's economy.

5. ***Building Tomorrow*** - Provide the roads, schools, hospitals and other public infrastructure to meet the needs of a growing economy and population.

Cooperation and coordination among all ministries is necessary to achieve these priorities, as is working within the resources available to your ministry. Your role will be key in supporting these efforts.

You will work with the Minister of Justice and Attorney General to:

- Promote strong and vibrant communities, and

Lead the following initiative:

- Conclude a new long-term governance and funding arrangement with and for the Métis Settlements that is focused on effective governance, enhanced accountability and sustainability.

In addition, as Minister of Aboriginal Relations, you will lead the following initiatives which will assist us in achieving our collective goals:

- Review *Alberta's First Nation Consultation Policy on Land Management and Resource Development* to increase the effectiveness of consultation processes; and
- Review the *Aboriginal Policy Framework* and Government of Alberta programs and services for Aboriginal peoples to enhance their effectiveness in increasing self-reliance and well-being of Aboriginal communities.

I consider this letter and your agreement to work on these priorities and initiatives, in addition to your core businesses in your ministry business plan, to be a contract between us. Your contributions and our commitment as a government, combined with Albertans' spirit to achieve, will help us to create an even stronger Alberta.
